Charter of Ethics

Comprehensive Policy for Faculty, Students, and Staff

[1] Preamble

Beni-Suef University (BSU) is dedicated to fostering a culture of **integrity**, **accountability**, **and excellence** in alignment with Egypt's national goals and global academic standards. This Charter defines the ethical obligations of all university members—students, faculty, and staff—to ensure a respectful, transparent, and productive academic environment.

Scope: Applies to all BSU campuses, affiliated institutions, and off-campus activities involving university representation.

[2] Core Ethical Principles

All members of BSU must adhere to:

- Integrity: Honesty in academic, professional, and personal conduct.
- **Respect**: Fair treatment regardless of gender, religion, or background.
- Accountability: Transparency in decision-making and resource use.
- **Social Responsibility**: Contributing to sustainable development and community welfare.

[3] Ethical Charter for Students

[3.1] Student Rights

Students are entitled to:

- Quality education with access to updated curricula and facilities.
- Fair and impartial evaluation (e.g., timely grade reviews, exam transparency).
- Privacy of personal data (e.g., protection of academic records).
- Freedom of expression within legal and ethical bounds.

[3.2] Student Responsibilities

• Attend lectures and complete assignments diligently.





- Avoid plagiarism or cheating (see **Penalties** below).
- Respect university property and report damages.
- Uphold BSU's reputation in public engagements.

[3.3] Prohibited Conduct & Disciplinary Actions

Violation	Penalty
Cheating in exams	Exam annulment + suspension (1 semester)
Vandalism	Fines + community service
Harassment	Suspension or expulsion
Fraudulent documentation	Legal action + permanent dismissal

Based on Egyptian Universities Organization Law No. 49/1972, Articles 123–129.

[3.4] Grievance Procedures

Students may appeal penalties by:

- 1. Submitting a written appeal to the **Student Affairs Office** within 15 days.
- 2. Escalating unresolved cases to the University Disciplinary Council.

[4] Ethical Charter for Faculty Members

[4.1] Teaching & Mentorship Ethics

- **Curriculum Delivery**: Provide syllabi, office hours, and fair grading rubrics.
- **Mentorship**: Guide students without discrimination (e.g., no favoritism).
- **Private Lessons**: Strictly prohibited to prevent conflicts of interest.

[4.1] Research Integrity

- **Originality**: Cite sources; no data fabrication.
- Safety: Protect human/animal subjects in experiments.
- **Collaboration**: Credit all contributors in publications.

[4.1] Professional Conduct

- Gifts/Donations: Must be disclosed and approved by the Ethics Committee.
- Conflicts of Interest: Avoid roles in external organizations that compromise BSU's interests.





[5] Ethical Charter for Administrative & Technical Staff

[5.1] Workplace Standards

- Confidentiality: Secure sensitive data (e.g., student records, financial documents).
- **Procurement**: Follow **Egyptian Tender Law No. 89/1998** for transparency.
- **Equal Opportunity**: No discrimination in hiring/promotions.

[5.2] Role-Specific Guidelines

- Lab Technicians: Maintain equipment logs and safety protocols.
- **PR Staff**: Represent BSU professionally in media/public events.

[6] Implementation & Enforcement

[6.1] Training & Awareness

- Mandatory annual workshops on ethics for all members.
- Online resources via BSU's Ethics Portal (<u>www.bsu.edu.eg/ethics</u>).

[6.2] Reporting Violations

[6.3] Disciplinary Process

- 1. **Investigation**: By a designated committee.
- 2. Hearing: Opportunity for the accused to respond.
- 3. **Resolution**: Ranging from warnings to termination, per BSU bylaws.
