HOW DO YOU APPLY FOR A CHEVENING SCHOLARSHIP?

- Ensure you meet all of the eligibility criteria.
- Find and select three master's degree courses at up to three UK universities.
- Apply online during the application window at chevening.org/apply.

In your application you will be asked about your leadership skills, networking skills, motivation to study in the UK with Chevening, and your goals for the future.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER YOU APPLY?

Early 2025

You will find out if you have been invited to attend an interview.

Mid 2025

You will find out if you have been conditionally selected for Chevening.

July 2025

You must have received an unconditional offer from at least one of your master's degree course choices by this time.

September – October 2025

If your application has been successful, you will begin your studies in the UK as a Chevening Scholar!

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR A CHEVENING SCHOLARSHIP?

There is no upper age limit for Chevening Scholarship applications. However, to be eligible you must:

- Be a citizen of one of the 160+ Chevening-eligible countries or territories.
- Return home for a minimum of two years after completing your master's degree.
- Have at least two years of work experience.
- Have completed an undergraduate degree that will enable you to apply for a postgraduate course at a UK university.
- Not have previously studied in the UK through a UK Government funded scholarship.
